Spring break! An opportunity to get away from winter in Michigan and travel somewhere warm. Some people even make a winter trip out of it and head north or out west to go skiing. People look forward to planning trips and vacations and then taking them and having fun together. Some families only get to plan and take one vacation a year. Others make multiple trips. Either way, the trips are something to look forward to.

I remember playing "road games" with my family in the car as we rode along together. We would play the "alphabet" game where we had to find words on billboards or road signs, words that started with the next letter of the alphabet. Or we would count tractors on our side of the car to see who got the highest number, and if we saw a cemetery, we would have to start over. Or we would sing songs together, either silly songs like "99 bottles of beer on the wall" or more meaningful songs like spiritual songs or hymns.

Have we even taken a religious vacation? The Hebrew people were expected to make three trips every year to Jerusalem. God laid out the plans for the trips in Deuteronomy 16:16.

Three times a year all your men must appear before the Lord your God at the place he will choose: at the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the Festival of Weeks and the Festival of Tabernacles. No one should appear before the Lord empty-handed...

At the Passover, Pentecost, and the feast of Tabernacles. As the people left their homes, some traveled great distances to get to Jerusalem. Jerusalem sat up on the mountain at almost 2,500 feet. The people coming down the Jordan River Valley would start that climb from over 800 feet below sea level. Altogether, they would have to climb around 3,300 feet. As they walked the road or rode their donkeys, they would sing. There are songs in the Psalms known as the songs of Ascent. These songs the people would sing as they made their way up to Jerusalem.

We are coming up on that time of year when we enter Lent, heading toward Passover and the Crucifixion and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are told in Luke's gospel, "As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem" (9:51). Jesus and the disciples went there to celebrate the Passover. And yet at different times, Jesus told his disciples why *he* was going there—he was going to fulfill the prophecies that he must suffer, be killed, and raised to life again.

As Jesus went up to Jerusalem to fulfill those prophecies, he likely sang the Psalms of Ascent with all the other pilgrims heading there. As we go through Lent, we are going to journey with Jesus and we are going to sing with Jesus the songs of Ascent, Psalms 120-134, as he set out to save us. Would you plan to make this Lent season an extended Spring Break, a religious holiday (Holy Day) as we travel with Jesus singing the songs of Ascent as we journey together?




### Our Mission






