

COUNCIL & DENOMINATION NEWS

The Planning & Visioning Committee would like input from the congregation about Allen Avenue's worship ministry. An electronic survey has been submitted to council by the Worship & Music Committee and was emailed with the bulletin on October 12. The survey will also be available in printed form. Your feedback is important and will be considered carefully as we seek to build a vibrant worshipping community at Allen Avenue CRC.

COUNCIL & DENOMINATION NEWS

Council Meeting Notes from October 1:

- 1. Pastor Mark will lead in worship on Monday evenings at The Village at Park Terrace senior apartments twice a month for the remainder of 2025.
- 2. The Building Committee needs more feedback regarding possible air conditioning.
- 3. The Council expressed thanks to the Congregational Life Committee and the Education committee for the fall kickoff meal provided to all.
- 4. Many new members have signed up to attend Women's Bible Study.
- 5. Technology Committee has begun work on installing a video monitor at the rear of the sanctuary to replace the one on the front row of the pews.
- 6. The Worship and Music Committee will distribute their worship survey soon.
- 7. Pastor Mark and Barb Malda were delegates for the October 2 meeting of Classis Muskegon.
- 8. Treasurer Amber Johnson presented the first draft of the 2026 budget.
- 9. Council approved a structure of 6 elders and 6 deacons for 2026.
- 10. The council member nomination list was finalized. Two new elders and two new deacons are needed for next year.
- 11. Council meets again on October 22.

During the last Council meeting, we began a discussion on potentially pursuing air conditioning for our sanctuary. We are asking for your input regarding the possibility of this major expense. The cost would be around \$85,000. We would likely secure significant pledges from the congregation before beginning a project like this. We are asking you to share your opinion with us. Please speak with Jack DeJonge (dejonge.jack@gmail.com) or any other council member. If we receive significant input in favor of pursuing AC, we will continue with our work on this. Then, after careful investigation, the Council would vote on whether to approve the project. If approved, a proposal would go before the congregation for the final approval vote.
